A strong Europe in a changing world

The Danish Presidency has two overarching priorities:

A secure Europe and a competitive and green Europe

Secure Europe

- Taking responsibility for the EU's own and EuroAtlantic security.
- Providing the necessary political, financial, civilian and military support for Ukraine.
- Increasing the EU's democratic resilience.
- building comprehensive and equal partnerships with third countries.
- Enlargement, including upholding the European community of values.
- Promoting economic security.

Competitive and green Europe

- Working for a modernisation of the Multiannual Financial Framework.
- Easing burdens, reducing barriers and promoting investments.
- Working for an open and strong EU trade policy.
- Ensuring an ambitious green transition in support of the EU's competitiveness.
- Focusing on new technologies.
- Exercising global climate leadership.

Framework for Presidency priorities within research and innovation

- The current situation demands focus on security, open strategic autonomy and increased European competitiveness.
- The research and innovation priorities are to been seen in this light, focusing on:
 - Closing Europe's innovation gap in critical technologies such as artificial intelligence, quantum technology, biotechnology, and space technology is essential.
 - and creating an optimal framework for excellent research and innovation, while simultaneously encouraging cooperation between public and private sectors.
- EU must transfer more research into innovation focus on all parts of the value chain from fundamental (basic) research to innovation, commercialisation and scale-up activities.

Key priority files within research and innovation

Legislative files:

- Next MFF proposal (16 July), including a competitiveness fund, a framework programme and a specific programme
- Amendment proposal of the EuroHPC regulation (2 July)

Non-legislative files:

- EU-strategy for life sciences (2 July)
 - Council Conclusions on the strategy
- EU-strategy for start-ups and scale-ups (28 May)
 - Council Conclusions on the research and innovation elements of the strategy
- Additionally: Euratom programme and ITER (September), EU-strategy for research and technology infrastructures (Q3), EU-strategy for AI in science (Q3), and more will follow....

Ministerial and other key events

- Informal ministerial meeting for research ministers: 16-17 July,
 Copenhagen
 - Topics: supporting European strengths within critical technologies and the future research and innovation efforts under the next MFF
- **Two Council meetings**: 30 September and 9 December, Brussels
- **ERAC meeting**: 16-17 October, Copenhagen


