

V4 Training for Research Project Managers

Brussels, 09-11 March 2026

The V4 Training for Research Project Managers is an intensive capacity-building event that aims to raise awareness of the political contexts of the EU's research and innovation programmes and initiatives with a special focus on the EU Framework Programmes for R&I. It targets a community of research managers and administrators (RMAs), understood broadly as R&I support personnel of both public and private organisations involved in the EU research and/or innovation projects – project managers, coordinators, project (support) officers etc. Organised twice a year by R&I liaison offices of the V4 countries in Brussels, the main purpose of the training is to increase the professional capacity of its participants by:

- providing targeted information about the **EU policies** that have an impact on their work
- enhancing their **networks** and networking skills
- creating opportunities to learn from **best practices of other organisations**

The programme of the 2026 spring edition is divided into three days and consists of presentations and interactive sessions. Each presentation slot will include time for questions. During the interactive parts, participants will have opportunities to network, share experience and discuss best practices within their institutions.

Effective communication is essential during networking and brokerage/matchmaking events, where participants typically have only a few minutes to present their institution's profile and strategic research priorities. These events provide an excellent opportunity for researchers and project managers to develop partnerships and increase their chances of being included in project consortia. These events also make institutions and/or their research networks more visible to the scientific community.

Preparation for the session: Participants will be divided into groups according to their areas of interest. Participants within each group will be invited to present their institution's profile and main research directions in two minutes without the aid of PowerPoint. While preparing your presentation, keep the following concept in mind: Imagine you are at a networking reception or brokerage event and want to find another institution to collaborate with. In no more than two minutes, convince a potential counterpart that your institution and researchers are solid partners for cooperation.
